Freedom of Religion or Belief in Vietnam: examples of violations









What is freedom of religion or belief?

- Article 18 of the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights
- Everyone shall have the right to freedom of thought, conscience and religion. This right shall include freedom to have or to adopt a religion or belief of his choice, and freedom, either individually or in community with others and in public or private, to manifest his religion or belief in worship, observance, practice and teaching.

What is freedom of religion or belief?

This means that:

- The right to have a religion or belief is an absolute right;
- The right to change a religion or belief is an absolute right;
- The right to *teach*, *practice*, *worship* and *observe* can only be limited under certain conditions prescribed by law.

How does it apply in Vietnam, locally?

The right to have a religion or belief

Whether or not a religion is legally recognised by the Vietnamese Government, you have the right to have that religion.

The right to adopt a religion or belief

Example of violation: people who have converted to Protestant Christianity have been forced to leave their homes or have been warned not to go to church.

The right to worship

Example of violation: Many Buddhists have been prevented from visiting pagodas of the United Buddhist Church of Vietnam (UCBV).

How does it apply in Vietnam, locally?

The right to observe

Example of violation: Cao Dai followers have been told that it is illegal to set up altars in their homes rather than state-approved temples.

The right to practice

Example of violation: Catholic Christians have been prevented from celebrating Mass, attending confession, and operating social welfare projects such as orphanages.

The right to teach

Example of violation: Hoa Hao Buddhists have been arrested and imprisoned for distributing books, CDs and DVDs of teachings of the founder, Huynh Phu So
