Thuc retired recently from his day job as a teacher. He has participated in a number of peaceful activities which protested China's activities in the East Sea (South China Sea), as well as activities connected to environmental protection and highlighted corruption. He was outspoken in his views on social media, including Facebook.

According to a statement made by Ms Dao Trang his daughter to DFD, and released on April 23, 2018, her father has been held incommunicado until recently when he was hospitalized as a result of being badly beaten by police. During a short visit with his family mid April, Mr. Thuc told them that in the first two months of detention, he was tortured by investigation officers who had also ordered the detention facility to leave him without food. The family was not permitted to supply food nor send money for him to purchase food from the detention facility's canteen. He was allowed to receive family's supports from the third month.

During interrogation, four police officers beat to coerce for confession. Ms Trang said police have also summoned her mother and brother to police station where they force them to talk about her father's activities that they had no knowledge of. In addition, Mr. Thuc has not been allowed to meet with a lawyer.

On September 19, the People's Court of Hoa Binh convicted him, sentencing him to 14 years in prison and 5 years of probation in a trial fails to meet international standards for fair trial. He has appealed the court's decision.

They were tried on 5 April, 2018, along with Nguyen Van Dai and Le Thu Ha. He received a 11 years sentence, followed by 3 years of house arrest. His appeal was denied on June 4, 2018.

Dung was arrested in April 2015 under Article 245 for "disturbing public order" after taking part in a rally calling for the protection of trees in Hanoi and sentenced that December to a 15-month prison term. His sentence was later commuted by an appeal court to 12 months and he was released in April 2016. On September 27, 2017 Nguyen Viet Dung was kidnapped by plainclothes agents at noon while taking lunch in his native province of Nghe An. According to local activists, no arrest warrant was presented before Dung was hauled away. According to his father, the Vietnamese police had "only issued an announcement" [acknowledging the arrest] due to strong public pressure. He was tried on April 12, 2018 by the People's Court of Nghe An province and sentenced to 7 years in prison followed by 5 years of house arrest. On Augst 15, the Higher People's Court in Hanoi reduced his jail sentence to six years.

Their car was stopped by police in Dien Chau district and police violently removed Binh from the car. He was initially detained in Nghe An temporary detention centre but his family learned he had been moved to B14 Detention Centre in Hanoi. He was supposed to face trial on January 25, 2018 for "resisting persons in the performance of their official duties" under Article 330 and "Abusing democratic freedoms to infringe upon the interests of the State" under Article 331 of the new 2015 Criminal Code, but the trial was postponed to Feb. 6, 2018. He received a 14 years sentence: 7 years for "abusing democratic freedoms to infringe state interests" and 7 years for "opposing officials on duty".

His appeal trial was held on April 24, 2018; the sentence was sustained.

A pastor of the Montagnard Evangelical Church of Christ, he advocated for religious freedom for his fellow church members in the Central Highlands and elsewhere. On April 28, 2017 he was sentenced to 5 years in prison for "helping individuals to escape abroad illegally", a charge he denied.

The Hmong people of Huoi Nom village in Dien Bien Province have practised Protestantism since 1998. The local government did not prevent people following the religion initially, but in 2006, the local authority demanded the church to register their activities with the authorities. The people did not agree with the request as they feared their religious practices would be subjected to the control of the authorities. In response, the local authorities have increased its repression of the church. They have stopped paying Hmong people for their forest protection and prevented people from gaining access to land for farming. When people cleaned their fields for croping other crops which could help them feed their families, local authorities accused them of destroying forest under Article 189 of the 1999 Penal Code.

On the evening March 24 2017, hundreds of police attacked the village, using batons, pepper spray and guns to suppress Hmong people.

Eight people were arrested and the village was ransacked, bibles and religious signs were confiscated. Ly A Thao was among eight Hmong Christians arrested. On September 13, 2017, they were convicted of "destroying forests" under Article 189 of the 1999 Penal Code, and all sentenced to 3.5 years in prison. The charge is politically-motivated as people just cleaned their land for cultivating other crops since the government refused to pay them forest protection support.

Police also said that Khanh had contacted people considered by the authorities as reactionary individuals, including former political prisoner Nguyen Van Hai (aka Dieu Cay), who is living in exile in the US after being years in prison in Vietnam. Khanh is also accused of helping to managed some websites of the Vietnam Reform Party (Viet Tan), a US based pro-democracy group considered as a terrorist organization by Vietnam's government. Khanh was tried on October 25, 2017 with "conducting anti-state propaganda" under Article 88.

In March 2018, Mrs Nga was transferred to Gia Trung prison camp in the Central Highlands province of Gia Lai, around 1,300 km from her native province of Ha Nam.

Co-founder and coordinator of the Network of Vietnamese Bloggers Me Nam is a well-known blogger both in the blogger community in Vietnam and internationally. She has been instrumental in human rights education in Vietnam in the past ten years through her blog posts and through her active participation in human rights promotion events off-line. She has written about politically sensitive issues such as police brutality, corruption, and has openly criticized controversial government's policies such as the bauxite mining in the Central Highlands (for which she was arrested for 10 days in 2009), and, more recently, the government handling of the massive fish deaths in Central Vietnam.
