In July 2016, he established the Coalition of Self-Determination [for] Vietnamese People, which seeks to end the rule of the Vietnamese Communist Party. In its letter dated August 18, 2017, sent to his wife Le Thi Thap, the People's Procuracy in Ho Chi Minh City said the investigation period will be extended for a second time from July 4 to October 31, 2017. Vinh and his friends Nguyen Van Duc Do, Nguyen Quoc Hoan, Phan Trung and Tu Cong Nghia were convicted by the People's Court of Ho Chi Minh City on accusation of subversion on October 5, 2018. He was prosecuted and detained on May 8, 2018 on charge of "abusing democratic freedom" under article 258 of the 1999 Penal Code.

Nguyen Van Truong is an online activist that has denounced officials of the Thai Nguyen province Police for corruption via his Facebook page and the YouTube channel vietlive.tv.  
More recently, Truong specifically denounced the director of the Thai Nguyen province Police for openly covering up for his subordinate at Vo Nhai district, Thai Nguyen province, in appropriating Truong's property, including a truck and some merchandise.  
Nguyen Van Truong was arrested on February 9, 2018, under Art. 331 of the 2015 Criminal Code, "Abusing democratic freedoms to infringe upon the interests of the State". He is currently detained in Thai Nguyen Detention Center, Thai Nguyen Province.

Name: Bui Thi Bich Tuyen

Sentence: 3 years

Bui Thi Bich Tuyen is Bui Van Trung's daughter. She was not arrested along with her brother and father in June 2017, but her movement has been restricted within her locality. She was tried on February 9 in An Giang province under Article 245, "Causing public disorder", and was sentenced to 3 years. Her appeal was denied and the sentence upheld on May 24, 2018.

Sentence: 9 years in prison (4 for the allegation under Article 318 and 5 years for the second charge)

A land rights and anti-corruption activist, Do Cong Dong was arrested on January 24, 2018 and detained for filming a forced eviction. He was charged with "causing public disorders" under Article 318 and "abusing democratic freedom" under Article 331 of the 2015 Penal Code.

On September 17, 2018, Mr. Duong was sentenced to four years in prison for the first charge. On October 12, 2018, he was convicted for the second charge and given five years in jail.

Sentence: 1 year

Vu Van Hung, a former teacher, pro-democracy activist and member of the Brotherhood for Democracy, was abducted from a lunch meeting on January 4, 2018. He is known for his environmental and social activism. He has been charged first with "causing public disorder" under Article 318 of the new 2015 Penal Code. The charge was later changed to "intentionally causing injury", under Article 134 of the 2015 Penal Code. As a former prisoner of conscience, he was arrested on September 8, 2008 and tried on October 2009 under Article 88. He was released in 2011 after serving his full 3 years sentence. He was tried on April 12, 2018 and sentenced to 1 year in prison.

Sentence: 2 years

Nguyen Nam Phong was the driver of Catholic priest Nguyen Dinh Thuc, from the Song Ngoc parish, and activist Hoang Duc Binh when Hoang Duc Binh was arrested on May 15, 2017 in Nghe An province. Binh was escorting priest Nguyen Dinh Thuc from the Song Ngoc parish in Dien Chau district to Vinh city. The police stopped their car in Dien Chau district's center and violently removed Binh from the car. When the police ordered the driver, Phong, to open the car to let them take Binh out, Phong refused. Nguyen Nam Phong was arrested 6 months after the incident, on November 28, 2017, and charged with "resisting persons in the performance of their official duties" under Article 330 of the 2015 Penal Code. He has faced trial on February 6, 2018, together with Hoang Duc Binh, and was sentenced to 2 years in prison.

Hoa Hao Buddhist and friend of Bui Quang Trung, Hanh was arrested on November 13, 2017 and charged under Article 245 of the 1999 Penal code, "Causing public disorder". She was sentenced on February 9, 2018, along with 5 other Hoa Hao Buddhists, to 3 years in prison. Her appeal was denied and the sentence upheld on May 24, 2018.

Sentence: 14 years in prison, five years of probation



On October 5, 2017, authorities in Vietnam's northern province of Hoa Binh arrested former teacher Dao Quang Thuc and accused him of carrying out activities aimed at overthrowing the people's administration, under Article 79 of the Penal Code. Thuc retired recently from his day job as a teacher. He has participated in a number of peaceful activities which protested China's activities in the East Sea (South China Sea), as well as activities connected to environmental protection and highlighted corruption. He was outspoken in his views on social media, including Facebook.

According to a statement made by Ms Dao Trang his daughter to DFD, and released on April 23, 2018, her father has been held incommunicado until recently when he was hospitalized as a result of being badly beaten by police. During a short visit with his family mid April, Mr. Thuc told them that in the first two months of detention, he was tortured by investigation officers who had also ordered the detention facility to leave him without food. The family was not permitted to supply food nor send money for him to purchase food from the detention facility's canteen. He was allowed to receive family's supports from the third month.



During interrogation, four police officers beat to coerce for confession. Ms Trang said police have also summoned her mother and brother to police station where they force them to talk about her father's activities that they had no knowledge of. In addition, Mr. Thuc has not been allowed to meet with a lawyer.




On September 19, the People's Court of Hoa Binh convicted him, sentencing him to 14 years in prison and 5 years of probation in a trial fails to meet international standards for fair trial. He has appealed the court's decision.

<p>She was arrested on October 18, 2017 and charged under Article 79 of the 1999 Penal Code. Xuan has been arrested in connection with activism related to the Formosa ecological disaster. According to Defend the Defenders, she was forced to waive her right to an attorney and her family was informed about her trial when it nearly ended. There are allegations that she has been treated with drugs that can damage human brain cells during her pre-trial detention and during the trial. She was tried on April 12, 2018 and sentenced to 9 years in prison followed by 5 years of house arrest by the People's Court of Ha Tinh.</p>

<p>Nguyen Van Tuc, a former prisoner of conscience and a member of the Brotherhood for Democracy, was arrested under Article 79 on September 1, 2017. He had previously served four years in prison under Article 88 for "propaganda against the state" from 2008 to 2012. He was at least the seventh member of Brotherhood for Democracy to be arrested in 2017. He was tried on April 10, 2018 by the People's Court of Thai Binh and sentenced to 13 years in prison and 5 years of probation. His appeal was rejected at the appeal hearing on September 15, 2018.</p>

<p>As a jurist, Nguyen Bac Truyen provided pro-bono legal assistance to families of political prisoners, victims of land grabs and persecuted religious communities in Southern Vietnam. Early in the morning of July 30, 2017, he was abducted by police while waiting for his wife (Bui Thi Kim Phuong) outside the Church of the Redemptorists in Ho Chi Minh City. He and 3 members of Brotherhood for Democracy, Nguyen Trung Ton, Pham Van Troi and Truong Minh Duc, were simultaneously arrested on July 30, 2017 at their homes in Hanoi, Ho Chi Minh City and Thanh Hoa. They were tried on 5 April, 2018, along with Nguyen Van Dai and Le Thu Ha. He received a 11 years sentence, followed by 3 years of house arrest. His appeal was denied on June 4, 2018.</p>

<p>Pham Van Troi is a human rights defender and a former President of the Brotherhood for Democracy. He was arrested in 2008 and charged with "conducting anti-state propaganda" under Article 88 of the Penal Code. He was sentenced to 4 years in prison and an additional 4 years under house arrest. Since his release in 2012, he has continued to work promoting human rights and multi-party democracy. He was tried on 5 April 2018, along with Nguyen Van Dai, Le Thu Ha and 3 members and former member of Brotherhood for Democracy. He received a 7 years sentence, followed by 1 year of house arrest. His appeal was denied on June 4, 2018.</p>

He and 3 members and former member of Brotherhood for Democracy were tried on 5 April 2018, along with Nguyen Van Dai and Le Thu Ha. He received a 12 years sentence, followed by 5 years of house arrest. His appeal was denied on June 4, 2018.</p>

<p>Truong Minh Duc is a citizen journalist and the Deputy Head of the Brotherhood for Democracy in the Southern region of the country. Since being released in 2012, he has been harassed and repeatedly assaulted by unidentified people working for the government. He and 3 members and former member of Brotherhood for Democracy were tried on 5 April 2018, along with Nguyen Van Dai and Le Thu Ha. He received a 12 years sentence, followed by 5 years of house arrest. His appeal was denied on June 4, 2018.</p>

Dung established the Republican Party, which is not recognised by the Vietnamese state, and the Loyalist Association of the ARVN in April 2015. He regularly participated in protests against China's influence over Vietnam, and its territorial claims in the South China Sea and expressed views critical of the Vietnamese government. Dung was arrested in April 2015 under Article 245 for "disturbing public order" after taking part in a rally calling for the protection of trees in Hanoi and sentenced that December to a 15-month prison term.
