Police previously arrested and beat him in 2003 and again in 2004 as he attempted to seek asylum in Cambodia.

¹ **Article 116** of Vietnam's 2015 Criminal Code (formerly Article 87), "sabotaging implementation of solidarity policies", **Article 118** (formerly Article 89), "disruption of security", and **Articles 120-121** (formerly Articles 91 and 275), "illegal emigration for the purpose of opposing the people's government" are national security crimes that carry penalties up to 15 years' imprisonment. Upon release from prison, national security offenders are subjected to additional punishment and placed under house arrest for up to five years under **Article 122**. During this time they are supervised, monitored, and "educated" by local authorities and police and forbidden from freely leaving their homes.

³ In Vietnam all religious groups are required to obtain government permission in order to operate. Members of independent religious communities such as **Dega Protestants** and **Ha Mon Catholics** are subjected to harsh persecution and punitive treatment. **Dega Protestantism** (*Tin Lanh Dega*) is an activist Montagnard church movement that emerged in the Central Highlands in 2000. It combines evangelical Christianity with aspirations for greater religious freedom, protection of ancestral lands, and for some, autonomy or self-rule. Members of the independent **Ha Mon Catholic sect** (*Dao Ha Mon*), which emerged in Kon Tum and Gia Lai provinces in 1999, have protested government relocation of villagers and the razing of Ha Mon village, the group's holy site, for construction of the Plei Krong hydropower dam. The government has banned both of these independent religious communities, asserting that they are "evil cults" instigated by Montagnards overseas as a cover for political activities. In addition to harassment, arrest and imprisonment, authorities have forced thousands of followers of both groups to renounce their faith since 2001.

¹⁰ **FULRO** (Front Unifié de Lutte des Race Opprimées, or the United Struggle Front for the Oppressed Races) was a Montagnard resistance movement in the Central Highlands that effectively died out in the early 1990s, when the last remaining insurgents disarmed in Cambodia and received asylum in the United States. While Vietnam's state media and an official government history of its security forces affirm that FULRO dissolved in 1992, authorities continue to accuse Montagnards belonging to unsanctioned churches of using their religion to organize a separatist political movement and revive FULRO. 


