Vietnam: Government and its Cao Dai sect disrupted a religious ceremony at the home of traditional Cao Dai Church followers in Tây Ninh Province. A sect member hit a victim.

(1) General information

<u>Summary</u>: The local government and 1997 Cao Dai Sect (government-controlled) forced Cao Dai believers to stop their important ceremony which involved installing the Divine Eye Banner on the altar of the family's home. A 1997 sect member struck a female victim.

- Did the incidents involve an individual or a group? Several adherents of the traditional, authentic Cao Dai Church.

- Location of incident: Tây Ninh Province, Vietnam

- Nationality and ethnic group of victim: Vietnamese national, Kinh (dominant ethnic group)

- Does national policy require registration for religious activities? If yes, what is the current status of the group? Yes, required. The Communist government established a Cao Dai denomination in 1997 with fundamental doctrinal differences from the authentic Cao Dai religion that was established in 1926.

(2) Identity of the persons concerned

The victims are followers of the traditional, authentic Cao Dai Church and authorizes Boat People SOS to speak for them.

(3) Information on the alleged violation(s)

• 28 January 2024

Around 12:30 pm, police officers and members of the government's 1997 Cao Dai sect came to the home of Mr. Lê Hoàng Thọ and used violence to stop the ceremony of Installation of the Divine Eye Banner. A member of the 1997 Cao Dai sect struck Ms. Nguyễn Thị Mai (the host's relative). The intruders and the family members and guests had a big argument. All the victims (traditional Cao Dai Church) had to come to the commune police station to be interrogated.
